

Neil Armstrong

Timothy Good wrote in his books that “reliable sources” told him of Neil Armstrong’s private confessions to strangers that he had encountered UFOs on Apollo-11.

In 1986, Armstrong wrote a letter to Good:

“Your reliable sources are unreliable. There were no objects reported, found or seen on Apollo 11 or any other Apollo flight other than of natural origin. All observations on all Apollo flights were fully reported to the public.”

Good published the denial letter in a subsequent book, “Above Top Secret.” But he later insisted the quotation was authentic, and occurred during a science conference, where he admits Armstrong’s name did not appear as a participant, but Good suggests the records were altered to conceal his presence there.
